This version of facility specific terms and conditions was converted from a database format to an HTML file during an upgrade of the Ohio EPA, Division of Air Pollution Control's permitting software. Every attempt has been made to convert the terms and conditions to look and substantively conform to the permit issued or being drafted in STARS. However, the format of the terms may vary slightly from the original. In addition, although it is not expected, there is a slight possibility that a term and condition may have been inadvertently "left out" of this reproduction during the conversion process. Therefore, if this version is to be used as a starting point in drafting a new version of a permit, it is imperative that the entire set of terms and conditions be reviewed to ensure they substantively mimic the issued permit. Part II - Specific Facility Terms and Conditions

a State and Federally Enforceable Section

1. Allowable Emission Limitations for the Facility

- a. The emissions of hazardous air pollutants (HAPs), as identified in Section 112(b) of Title III of the Clean Air Act, shall not exceed 10 TPY for any individual HAP, as a rolling, 12-month summation, and 25 TPY for any combination of HAPs, as a rolling, 12-month summation.

2. Operational Limitations

Compliance with the above-mentioned emission limitations shall be achieved by restricting gasoline throughput. The annual throughput of gasoline shall not exceed 1,183,007,375 gallons. In order to ensure federal enforceability during the first 12 calendar months of operation after the issuance of this permit, the permittee shall not exceed the following maximum allowable, cumulative, throughput limitations (gallons):

After the first 12 calendar months of operation following the issuance of this permit, compliance with the annual throughput limitation shall be based upon rolling, 12-month summations.

The facility does not handle distillates and transmix. The facility currently handles gasoline and a small amount of additives (1/1000 gallons of gasoline) which, for purposes of this permit, shall be considered as "gasoline" and included in the gasoline throughput limitation. Any future use of transmix, distillates or other additives shall also be considered as "gasoline" and included in the gasoline throughput limitation until Sun submits and obtains a modified permit to operate that specifically addresses the use of distillates, transmix and additives.

3. Record Keeping Requirements

The permittee shall maintain monthly records of the following information:

- a. the total throughput of gasoline, in gallons;
- b. the cumulative throughput of gasoline, in gallons, for each calendar month during the first 12 months of operation following the issuance of this permit; and
- c. beginning after the first 12 months of operation following the issuance of this permit, the rolling, 12-month summation of the total throughput of gasoline, in gallons.

4. Reporting Requirements

a. The permittee shall submit deviation (excursion) reports which identify all exceedances of the rolling, 12-month throughput limitation, and for the first 12 calendar months of operation following the issuance of this permit, all exceedances of the maximum allowable, cumulative, throughput levels established in A.2 above.

b. The permittee shall submit annual reports which identify the following:

- i. the total actual emissions of each individual HAP from the facility;
- ii. the total actual emissions of all of the HAPs from the facility;

iii. the total annual throughput of gasoline; and

iv. the total annual VOC emissions, in tons.

These annual reports shall be submitted by April 15 of each year, and shall cover the previous calendar year.

5. Compliance Methods

To calculate VOC emissions for the purpose of determining compliance with the applicable emission limitations of this permit, the permittee shall comply with the following:

a. VOC emissions from the storage tanks shall be determined using the USEPA's "Tanks Program 3.0."

b. VOC emissions from gasoline truck loading shall be determined using the most recent VOC stack test results and a vapor-tightness loss rate of 9 milligrams per liter (mg/l) from the trucks. The 9 mg/l leakage emission factor is calculated using 0.5% as the average leakage from a truck passing the 3-inch pressure decay test (USEPA, 1980: Bulk Gasoline Terminals - Background Information for Proposed Standards, Table C-4).

c. The VOC emissions from fugitive emissions (e.g., valves, fittings, and pumps) shall be determined using EPA-453/R-95-017, "Protocol for Equipment Leak Emission Estimates."

d. The HAP emissions from gasoline truck loading and storage shall be determined using the following emissions factors:

i. benzene - 0.0102 pound of benzene emissions per pound of VOC emissions;

ii. cumene - 0.0001 pound of cumene emissions per pound of VOC emissions;

iii. toluene - 0.0166 pound of toluene emissions per pound of VOC emissions;

iv. xylene - 0.0058 pound of xylene emissions per pound of VOC emissions;

v. ethyl benzene - 0.001 pound of ethyl benzene emissions per pound of VOC emissions;

vi. n-hexane - 0.0168 pound of n-hexane per pound of VOC emissions; and

vii. isooctane - 0.0052 pound of isooctane per pound of VOC emissions.

These emission factors are based on the liquid weight percent (weight fraction) of each HAP in the gasoline. Speciated emissions were estimated based on equations found in AP-42, 5th Edition, Section 7.1.4, Hazardous Air Pollutant (HAP) Speciation Methodology.

e. Should more accurate emission factors be developed during the current permit cycle, the permittee shall use them, provided the new emission factors are mutually agreeable to the Ohio EPA Central District Office, and the Sun Company, Inc.

2. Additional Terms and Conditions

- a. The loading rack shall be equipped with a vapor collection system whereby during the transfer of gasoline to any delivery vessel:
 - (a)
 - i. all vapors displaced from the delivery vessel during loading are vented only to the vapor collection system; and
 - ii. the pressure in the vapor collection system is maintained between minus 6 and plus 18 inches of water gauge pressure.
 - b. The loading rack shall be equipped with a vapor control system whereby:
 - i. all vapors collected by the vapor collection system are vented to the vapor control system;
 - ii. the mass emissions of VOC from the vapor control system do not exceed 0.67 pound of VOC per 1000 gallons (80 milligrams of VOC per liter) of gasoline loaded into the delivery vessel; and
 - iii. any liquid gasoline returned to a stationary storage tank from the vapor control system is free of entrained air to the extent possible with good engineering design.
 - c. A means shall be provided to prevent drainage of gasoline from the loading device when it is not in use or to accomplish complete drainage before the loading device is disconnected.
 - d. All gasoline loading lines and vapor lines shall be equipped with fittings which are vapor tight.

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II. Operational Restrictions

1. The permittee shall not permit gasoline to be spilled, discarded in sewers, stored in open containers or handled in any other manner that would result in evaporation.
2. The permittee shall repair within 15 days any leak from the vapor collection system and vapor control system when such leak is equal to or greater than 100 percent of the lower explosive limit as propane, as determined under paragraph (K) of OAC rule 3745-21-10.

3. The maximum exhaust gas VOC concentration shall not exceed 4 percent (as propane) from the carbon adsorption vessels. [A VOC concentration that exceeds 4 percent (as propane) is not necessarily indicative of a violation of the allowable mass emission limitation (80 mg/l), but rather serves as a trigger level for maintenance and/or repair activities, or further investigation to establish correct operation.]

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III. Monitoring and/or Record Keeping Requirements

1. The permittee shall perform monthly monitoring of the exhaust gas VOC concentration from both carbon adsorption vessels on the VRU using the 40 CFR Part 60, Appendix A, Method 21 procedure for open ended lines. The highest VOC concentration, as measured during the processing of vapors during the last 5 minutes of the adsorption cycle for each vessel, shall be recorded. The permittee shall maintain records of the monthly monitored VOC concentrations detected in the exhaust gases from the VRU. This recordkeeping shall begin 90 days after the issuance of the permit to operate.

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IV. Reporting Requirements

1. The permittee shall submit semiannual reports indicating any exceedances of the VOC concentration limit, along with the cause of the exceedance and an explanation of any corrective action taken to prevent a similar exceedance in the future. These semiannual reports shall be submitted by February 15 and August 15 of each year and shall address the data obtained during the previous 6 calendar months (July through December, and January through June, respectively).

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V. Testing Requirements

1. The permittee shall conduct, or have conducted, emission testing for this emissions unit in accordance with the following requirements:
 - a. The emission testing shall be conducted within 12 months prior to permit renewal during the summer months when the gasoline vapor pressure is highest.
 - b. The emission testing shall be conducted to demonstrate compliance with the allowable mass emission rate for VOC.
 - c. The following test methods and procedures from 40 CFR Part 60 shall be employed to demonstrate compliance with the allowable VOC mass emission rate(s):
Method 2A inlet vapor volume
Method 21 potential leak sources
Method 25B inlet and outlet VOC concentration
Subpart XX [60.503(d)] tank truck maximum pressure
 - d. The test(s) shall be conducted while the emissions unit is operating at or near its maximum capacity, unless otherwise specified or approved by the appropriate Ohio EPA District Office or local air agency.
2. Not later than 30 days prior to the proposed test date(s), the permittee shall submit an "Intent to Test" notification to the appropriate Ohio EPA District Office or local air agency. The "Intent to Test" notification shall describe in detail the proposed test methods and procedures, the emissions unit operating parameters, the time(s) and date(s) of the test(s), and the person(s) who will be conducting the test(s). Failure to submit such notification for review and approval prior to the test(s) may result in the Ohio EPA District Office's or local air agency's refusal to accept the results of the emission test(s).

Personnel from the appropriate Ohio EPA District Office or local air agency shall be permitted to witness the test(s), examine the testing equipment, and acquire data and information necessary to ensure that the operation of the emissions unit and the testing procedures provide a valid characterization of the emissions from the emissions unit and/or the performance of the control equipment.

A comprehensive written report on the results of the emissions test(s) shall be signed by the person or persons responsible for the tests and submitted to the appropriate Ohio EPA District Office or local air agency within 30 days following completion of the test(s).
