The above named entity is hereby granted a Permit to Install for the above described emissions unit(s) pursuant to Chapter 3745-31 of the Ohio Administrative Code. Issuance of this permit does not constitute expressed or implied approval or agreement that, if constructed or modified in accordance with the plans included in the application, the above described emissions unit(s) of environmental pollutants will operate in compliance with applicable State and Federal laws and regulations, and does not constitute expressed or implied assurance that if constructed or modified in accordance with those plans and specifications, the above described emissions unit(s) of pollutants will be granted the necessary permits to operate (air) or NPDES permits as applicable.

This permit is granted subject to the conditions attached hereto.

Part I - GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

A. Permit to Install General Terms and Conditions

1. Compliance Requirements

The emissions unit(s) identified in this Permit to Install shall remain in full compliance with all applicable State laws and regulations and the terms and conditions of this permit.

2. Reporting Requirements Related to Monitoring and Recordkeeping Requirements

The permittee shall submit required reports in the following manner:

- a. Reports of any required monitoring and/or recordkeeping information shall be submitted to the appropriate Ohio EPA District Office or local air agency.
- b. Except as otherwise may be provided in the terms and conditions for a specific emissions unit, quarterly written reports of (a) any deviations (excursions) from emission limitations, operational restrictions, and control device operating parameter limitations that have been detected by the testing, monitoring, and recordkeeping requirements specified in this permit, (b) the probable cause of such deviations, and (c) any corrective actions or preventive measures which have been or will be taken, shall be submitted to the appropriate Ohio EPA District Office or local air agency. If no deviations occurred during a calendar quarter, the permittee shall submit a quarterly report, which states that no deviations occurred during that quarter. The reports shall be submitted quarterly, i.e., by January 31, April 30, July 31, and October 31 of each year and shall cover the previous calendar quarters. (These quarterly reports shall exclude deviations resulting from malfunctions reported in accordance with OAC rule 3745-15-06.)

3. Records Retention Requirements

Each record of any monitoring data, testing data, and support information required pursuant to this permit shall be retained for a period of five years from the date the record was created. Support information shall include, but not be limited to, all calibration and maintenance records and all original strip-chart recordings for continuous monitoring instrumentation, and copies of all reports required by this permit. Such records may be maintained in computerized form.

4. Inspections and Information Requests

The Director of the Ohio EPA, or an authorized representative of the Director, may, subject to the safety requirements of the permittee and without undue delay, enter upon the premises of this source at any reasonable time for purposes of making inspections, conducting tests, examining records or reports pertaining to any emission of air contaminants, and determining compliance with any applicable State air pollution laws and regulations and the terms and conditions of this permit. The permittee shall furnish to the Director of the Ohio EPA, or an authorized representative of the Director, upon receipt of a written request and within a reasonable time, any information that may

be requested to determine whether cause exists for modifying, reopening or revoking this permit or to determine compliance with this permit. Upon verbal or written request, the permittee shall also furnish to the Director of the Ohio EPA, or an authorized representative of the Director, copies of records required to be kept by this permit.

5. Scheduled Maintenance/Malfunction Reporting

Any scheduled maintenance of air pollution control equipment shall be performed in accordance with paragraph (A) of OAC rule 3745-15-06. The malfunction of any emissions units or any associated air pollution control system(s) shall be reported to the appropriate Ohio EPA District Office or local air agency in accordance with paragraph (B) of OAC rule 3745-15-06. Except as provided in that rule, any scheduled maintenance or malfunction necessitating the shutdown or bypassing of any air pollution control system(s) shall be accompanied by the shutdown of the emissions unit(s) that is (are) served by such control system(s).

6. Permit Transfers

Any transferee of this permit shall assume the responsibilities of the prior permit holder. The appropriate Ohio EPA District Office or local air agency must be notified in writing of any transfer of this permit.

7. Air Pollution Nuisance

The air contaminants emitted by the emissions units covered by this permit shall not cause a public nuisance, in violation of OAC rule 3745-15-07.

8. Termination of Permit to Install

This Permit to Install shall terminate within eighteen months of the effective date of the Permit to Install if the owner or operator has not undertaken a continuing program of installation or modification or has not entered into a binding contractual obligation to undertake and complete within a reasonable time a continuing program of installation or modification. This deadline may be extended by up to 12 months if application is made to the Director within a reasonable time before the termination date and the party shows good cause for any such extension.

9. Construction of New Sources(s)

The proposed emissions unit(s) shall be constructed in strict accordance with the plans and application submitted for this permit to the Director of the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency. There may be no deviation from the approved plans without the express, written approval of the Agency. Any deviations from the approved plans or the above conditions may lead to such sanctions and penalties as provided under Ohio law. Approval of these plans does not constitute an assurance that the proposed facilities will operate in compliance with all Ohio laws and regulations. Additional facilities shall be installed upon orders of the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency if the proposed sources are inadequate or cannot meet applicable standards.

If the construction of the proposed emissions unit(s) has already begun or has been completed prior to the date the Director of the Environmental Protection Agency approves the permit application and plans, the approval does not constitute expressed or implied assurance that the proposed facility has been constructed in accordance with the approved plans. The action of beginning and/or completing construction prior to obtaining the Director's approval constitutes a violation of OAC rule 3745-31-02. Furthermore, issuance of the Permit to Install does not constitute an assurance that the proposed source will operate in compliance with all Ohio laws and regulations. Approval of the plans in any case is not to be construed as an approval of the facility as constructed and/or completed. Moreover, issuance of the Permit to Install is not to be construed as a waiver of any rights that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (or other persons) may have against the applicant for starting construction prior to the effective date of the permit. Additional facilities shall be installed upon orders of the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency if the proposed facilities prove to be inadequate or cannot meet applicable standards.

10. Public Disclosure

The facility is hereby notified that this permit, and all agency records concerning the operation of this permitted source, are subject to public disclosure in accordance with OAC rule 3745-49-03.

11. Applicability

This Permit to Install is applicable only to the emissions unit(s) identified in the Permit to Install. Separate application must be made to the Director for the installation or modification of any other emissions unit(s).

12. Best Available Technology

As specified in OAC Rule 3745-31-05, all new sources must employ Best Available Technology (BAT). Compliance with the terms and conditions of this permit will fulfill this requirement.

13. Source Operation and Operating Permit Requirements After Completion of Construction

This facility is permitted to operate each source described by this Permit to Install for a period of up to one year from the date the source commenced operation. This permission to operate is granted only if the facility complies with all requirements contained in this permit and all applicable air pollution laws, regulations, and policies. Pursuant to OAC Chapter 3745-35, the permittee shall submit a complete operating permit application within thirty (30) days after commencing operation of the emissions unit(s) covered by this permit.

14. Construction Compliance Certification

The applicant shall provide Ohio EPA with a written certification (see enclosed form) that the facility has been constructed in accordance with the Permit to Install application and the terms and conditions of the Permit to Install. The certification shall be provided to Ohio EPA upon completion of construction but prior to startup of the source.

15. Fees

The permittee shall pay fees to the Director of the Ohio EPA in accordance with ORC section 3745.11 and OAC Chapter 3745-78. The permittee shall pay all applicable Permit to Install fees within 30 days after the issuance of this Permit to Install.

2. **Additional Terms and Conditions**

- 2.a Particulate emissions shall not exceed 2.72 tons per year.
- 2.b Visible emissions shall not exceed 5% from any building opening, on a three-minute average.

B. Operational Restrictions

1. The permittee shall operate the grinder/ chipper only in the building enclosure.

C. Monitoring and/or Recordkeeping Requirements

1. The permittee shall maintain daily records that document any time periods when the emissions unit was operated outside the building enclosure.

D. Reporting Requirements

1. The permittee shall notify the Director (Ohio EPA, Northeast District Office) in writing of any daily record showing that the emissions unit was operated outside the building enclosure. The notification shall include a copy of such record and shall be sent to the Director (Ohio EPA, Northeast District Office) within 30 days after the event occurs.

E. Testing Requirements

1. Compliance with the allowable emissions limitations in Section A.1 and A.2 of these terms and conditions shall be determined in accordance with the following methods:

- 1.a Emissions Limitation:
2.72 tons per year of particulate emissions

Applicable Compliance Method:

Compliance with this emissions limit shall be the sum of the emissions from the grinder and from the chipper and be determined according to the following equation:

$$\text{EPM}_{\text{yr}} = (19,437 \text{ tons/yr}) \times (0.35 \text{ lb/ton wood waste}) \times (\text{ton}/2000 \text{ lbs}) \times (1-0.60) + (19,437 \text{ tons/yr}) \times (0.35 \text{ lb/ton wood waste}) \times (\text{ton}/2000 \text{ lbs}) \times (1-0.60)$$

where:

19,437 tons per year is the maximum annual throughput;

0.35 lb/ton wood is the emission factor from RACM Chapter 2.17, Woodworking, table 1, sawing; and

60% is the control factor for a three sided enclosure according to RACM Chapter 2.17, Woodworking, table 3.

- 1.b Emissions Limitation:
Visible emissions shall not exceed 5% opacity from any opening, on a 3-minute average.

Applicable Compliance Method:

Compliance shall be determined by US EPA Method 9, (40 CFR Part 60, Appendix A).

2. **Additional Terms and Conditions**

- 2.a Particulate emissions shall not exceed 14.58 tons per year.
- 2.b There shall be no visible particulate emissions from any sawdust storage pile and the sawdust storage building except for thirteen minutes during any sixty-minute period.
- 2.c Visible particulate emissions shall not exceed 5% opacity as a three-minute average from the sawdust silo vent.

B. Operational Restrictions

1. All sawdust shall be stored inside the enclosure.
2. The sawdust silo vent shall be controlled by a cyclone or similar control device at all times the sawdust silo is loaded or unloaded.

C. Monitoring and/or Recordkeeping Requirements

1. The permittee shall maintain daily records that document all time periods when the sawdust piles were stored outside the sawdust storage building.
2. The permittee shall maintain daily records that document all time periods when the cyclone was not in service when the emissions unit was in operation.

D. Reporting Requirements

1. The permittee shall notify the Director (Ohio EPA, Northeast District Office) in writing of any daily record showing that the sawdust piles were stored outside the sawdust storage building. The notification shall include a copy of such record and shall be sent to the Director (Ohio EPA, Northeast District Office) within 30 days after the event occurs.
2. The permittee shall notify the Director (Ohio EPA, Northeast District Office) in writing of any daily record showing that the cyclone was not in service when the emissions unit was in operation. The notification shall include a copy of such record and shall be sent to the Director (Ohio EPA, Northeast District Office) within 30 days after the event occurs.

E. Testing Requirements

1. Compliance with the allowable emissions limitations in Section A.1 and A.2 of these terms and conditions shall be determined in accordance with the following methods:

- 1.a Emissions Limitation:
14.58 tons per year of particulate emissions

Applicable Compliance Method:

Compliance with this emissions limit shall be the sum of particulate emissions from the truck unloading, sawdust handling and the sawdust storage silo vent, and shall be determined according to the following equation:

$$\text{EPM yr} = [(19,437 \text{ tons/yr}) \times (1.0 \text{ lb/ton sawdust}) \times (\text{ton}/2000 \text{ lbs})] + [(19,437 \text{ tons/yr}) \times (1.0 \text{ lb/ton sawdust}) \times (\text{ton}/2000 \text{ lbs}) \times (1-0.60)] + [(19,437 \text{ tons/yr}) \times (1.0 \text{ lb/ton wood waste}) \times (\text{ton}/2000 \text{ lbs}) \times (1-.90)]$$

where:

19,437 tons per year is the maximum annual throughput;

1.0 lb/ton wood is the emission factor from RACM Chapter 2.17, Woodworking, table 1, for sawdust pile loading, unloading and storage and wood waste storage bin vent;

60% is the control efficiency for a three sided enclosure according to RACM Chapter 2.17, Woodworking, table 3;

1.0 lb/ton wood is the emission factor from RACM Chapter 2.17, Woodworking, table 1, wood waste storage bin vent; and

90% is the assumed control efficiency for cyclone controlling the sawdust silo vent.

- 1.b Emissions Limitation:
No visible particulate emissions from any sawdust storage pile, the sawdust storage building and the sawdust storage silo except for thirteen minutes during any sixty-minute period.

Applicable Compliance Method:

Compliance shall be determined according to OAC rule 3745-17-03(B)(4), US EPA Method 22, (40 CFR Part 60, Appendix A).

1.c Emissions Limitation:

Visible particulate emissions shall not exceed 5% opacity as a three-minute average from the sawdust silo vent.

Applicable Compliance Method:

Compliance shall be determined according to OAC rule 3745-17-03(B), US EPA Method 9, (40 CFR 60, Appendix A).

This PTI is for the grinder/chipper (F001) to process wood scrap into sawdust, and for the sawdust handling (F002) truck unloading, pile unloading, the sawdust building and the sawdust silo vent. The sawdust silo is a pneumatic fill system with a cyclone controlling the silo vent. F001 has not been installed. F002 was installed in 1992.
