

Dear Mr. Flickinger:

After reviewing our Biodiversity Database, I find the Division of Wildlife has no records of rare or endangered species in the Seasons Rd. Commerce Center commercial development project area, including a one mile radius, on Seasons Rd. just east of Sullivan Rd. in Hudson Township, Summit County, and on the Hudson Quad. We are unaware of any unique ecological sites, geologic features, animal assemblages, scenic rivers, state wildlife areas, nature preserves, parks or forests, national wildlife refuges, parks or forests or other protected natural areas within a one mile radius of the project area.

Our inventory program has not completely surveyed Ohio and relies on information supplied by many individuals and organizations. Therefore, a lack of records for any particular area is not a statement that rare species or unique features are absent from that area. Although we inventory all types of plant communities, we only maintain records on the highest quality areas.





I have reviewed the wetland delineation map you submitted for an approximately 161-acre parcel located north of Seasons Road, in the City of Hudson, Summit County, Ohio.

I am hereby verifying the Federal wetland boundaries as shown on the attached wetland delineation map. This verification will remain valid for a period of five (5) years from the date of this correspondence unless new information warrants revision of the delineation before the expiration. At the end of this period, a new wetland delineation will be required if a project has not been completed on this property and additional impacts are proposed for waters of the United States. Further, this delineation/determination has been conducted to identify the limits of the Corps Clean Water Act jurisdiction for the particular site identified in this request. This delineation/determination may not be valid for the wetland conservation provisions of the Food Security Act of 1985, as amended. If you or your tenant are USDA program participants, or anticipate participation in USDA programs, you should request a certified wetland determination from the local office of the Natural Resource Conservation Service prior to starting work.

Based upon my review of the submitted delineation and on-site observations, I have determined that fourteen wetlands, Wetlands A (0.015 acres), B (0.066 acres), C (6.438 acres), D (0.123 acre), E (1.399 acres), F (1.311 acres), G (3.890 acres), H (5.698 acres), I (1.319 acres), J (6.736 acres), K (0.359 acres), L (0.270 acres), N (0.712 acres), and O (0.539 acres), totaling 28.878 acres, four streams, Streams 1 (796.23 linear feet), 2 (275.74 linear feet), 3 (483.16 linear feet), and Powers Brook (1452.72 linear feet), totaling 3007.85 linear feet, and open water, totaling 0.610 acres, on the subject parcel are part of a surface water tributary system to a navigable water of the United States as noted on the attached Jurisdictional Determination form. Therefore, these wetlands, streams, and open area are regulated under Section 404 of the Clean Water Act. Department of the Army authorization is required if you propose a discharge of dredged or fill material in these areas.

In addition, I have determined that there is no clear surface water connection or ecological continuum between one wetland, Wetland M (0.003 acres), on the subject parcel and a surface tributary system to a navigable water of the United States. Therefore, this water is considered isolated, non-navigable, intrastate, and not regulated under Section 404 of the Clean Water Act. Accordingly, you do not need Department of the Army authorization to commence work in this area.

I encourage you to contact the appropriate state and local governmental officials to ensure that the proposed work complies with their requirements.

Finally, this letter contains an approved jurisdictional determination for the subject parcel. If you object to this determination, you may request an administrative appeal under Corps regulations at 33 CFR Part 331. Enclosed you will find a Notification of Appeal Process (NAP) fact sheet and Request for Appeal (RFA) form. If you request to appeal the above determination, you must submit a completed RFA form within 60 days of the date on this letter to the Great Lakes/Ohio River Division Office at the following address:

In order for an RFA to be accepted by the Corps, the Corps must determine that it is complete, that it meets the criteria for appeal under 33 C.F.R. part 331.5, and that it has been received by the Division Office within 60 days of the date of the NAP. Should you decide to submit an RFA form, it must be received at the above address by **December 25, 2010**.

It is not necessary to submit an RFA to the Division office if you do not object to the determination in this letter.






