1	<p><u>Akron: Laura Miracle</u></p> <p>OAC rule 3745-17-09(B):</p> <p>No person shall cause, suffer, or allow to be emitted into the ambient air from any incinerators, particulate emissions in the exhaust gases in excess of: 0.10 pound per one hundred pounds of liquid, semi-solid or solid refuse and salvageable material charged, for incinerators having incineration capacities equal to or greater than one hundred pounds per hour; or 0.20 pound per one hundred pounds of liquid, semisolid or solid refuse and salvageable material charged for incinerators having incineration capacities less than one hundred pounds per hour.</p> <p>OAC rule 3745-17-01 does not define incineration capacities. What does incineration capacities mean? Does it include the weight of salvageable material? Or does it include only the weight of liquid, semi-solid or solid refuse charged?</p>	Mike Hopkins/ Andrew Hall
2	<p><u>Canton: Terri Dzienis</u></p> <p>RMP: When a permit application has "subject to regulation" for the Risk Management Plan requirements, what needs to be done by the permit writer: Do they need to contact the RMP group? 3	<p><u>Canton: Terri Dzienis</u></p> <p>Non-road Engines: The definition of a non-road engine in OAC rule 3745-31-01(CCCC) states that any engine that replaces an engine at a location that is intended to perform the same or similar function as the engine replaced will be included in calculating the consecutive time period for the 12-month criteria. However, I am uncertain what the definition of location is. The rules state that a location is a single site at a building, structure, facility, or installation. Is any area around a structure that equipment is hooked up to considered a single site, or is single site specifically one single space on the ground? Basically I want to know if a company switches out the engine within 12 months and places the new engine in a different spot (but connected to the same equipment) if that would qualify as a new location.</p>	Mike Hopkins/ Andrew Hall
4	<p><u>Canton: Terri Dzienis</u></p> <p>BAT: Can existing BAT be changed when there is no Ch31 modification but per facility request? Scenarios: #1 BAT requires a scrubber and the facility would like to replace it with a baghouse. #2 BAT requires water sprays and the facility would like to replace with total enclosure. #3 BAT contains VOC emission limit and the facility changed materials to non-</p>	Mike Hopkins/ Andrew Hall

	VOC containing materials and wants the VOC limit removed. #4 BAT requires 2 cyclones and 3 binvents to be installed on a process line but the facility only installed 1 cyclone and 2 binvents and requested BAT to updated to reflect the actual equipment.	
5	<p>Canton: Terri Dzienis NTV FER Review:</p> <p>If a Bluecard is marked as "Approve/Revision Needed" (since the emissions are correct but other information (like contact info) is incorrect) and a separate revised report is submitted, is it necessary to mark the original report as "Report Not Needed"? From my understanding it is not necessary to change that status because Central Office knows not to invoice a facility twice.</p> <p>If a Bluecard is marked as "Approve/Revision Needed" (since the emissions are correct but other information (like contact info) is incorrect) and Central Office is requested to make the corrections to the report (no separate report will be submitted), is it necessary to mark the report as "Approved" after the changes are made?</p> <p>If a FER/Bluecard review to-do task is placed on referral (since what on the facility for information), does that stop the FER review period of what is used to measure review performance or just the task period?</p>	Linda Lazich/ Elisa Thomas
6	<p>Stars2 Deploy v 2.3.1 – March 4th</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • File attachment size increased to 2147 MB – allows an increase in attachment size for reports, permit applications, emissions reports, and emissions tests. Previously there was a 60 MB limit for attachment size. The total public and trade secret attachments size now cannot exceed 2147 MB.
