APPLICATION (LEVEL 2)**

Public notice is hereby given that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA) Division of Surface Water (DSW) has received an application for, and has begun to consider whether to issue or deny, an Isolated Wetland Permit (Level 2) for a project to fill 1.05 acres of Category 1 isolated wetlands for a 66 unit town home project. UPDATE OF STATE WATER QUALITY MANAGEMENT PLAN

Notice is hereby given that the Toledo Metropolitan Area Council of Governments (TMACOG) has submitted the *Areawide Water Quality Management Plan, Chapters 3 and 4* to the Ohio EPA for certification pursuant to Sections 208 and 303 of the Clean Water Act. Chapter 3 covers the water quality management framework and Chapter 4 provides specific information on public wastewater treatment, including updated descriptions and maps of 60 facility planning areas for 80 designated management agencies. Designated management agencies for storm water and agriculture nonpoint pollution are also identified.

In order to afford all potentially affected parties the opportunity to comment, Ohio EPA will hold a public meeting on June 20, 2002 at 7 PM at the Ohio EPA Northwest District Office, 347 North Dunbridge Road, Bowling Green. Written comments will be accepted until July 19, 2002. Pursuant to applicable regulations, the State of Ohio has authority to certify that the TMACOG 208 planning documents include the required plan elements, are consistent with one another, and are consistent with basin plans.

OF PUBLIC HEARING FOR SECTION 401 CERTIFICATION**

Public notice is hereby given that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA) Division of Surface Water (DSW) is reviewing an application, and has begun to consider whether to issue or deny, a Clean Water Act Section 401 certification for a project to place fill in wetlands and an unnamed drainageway to Porter Creek in conjunction with the construction of an assisted living cluster development. The application was submitted by Good Samaritan Nursing Home, 193 Forest Hill, Avon Lake, Ohio 44012. The project is located north of Detroit Road, in the City of Avon, Lorain County. The discharges from the activity, if approved, would result in degradation to, or lowering of, the water quality of Porter Creek. The review of the application will be conducted, and a decision whether to grant or deny the application will be made, in accordance with Chapters 3745-1-05, 3745-1 and 3745-32 of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC). In accordance with OAC 3745-1-05, an antidegradation review of the application will be conducted before deciding whether to allow a lowering of the water quality. Other alternatives resulting in lesser or no degradation, or lowering of water quality, will be considered by Ohio EPA during the review process.

No exclusions or waivers, as outlined by Paragraph 3745-1-05 (D) of the Antidegradation Rule, apply or may be granted by the Director of Ohio EPA.

OHIO EPA REISSUES FINAL TEMPORARY AUTHORIZATION

On May 7, 2001, Ohio EPA reissued a final temporary authorization to Solvay Advanced Polymers, L.L.C., (Solvay) for its facility at State Route 7, Marietta, Ohio 45750. The EPA Identification Number for this facility is OHD981529688.

Why does BP Amoco Polymers Inc. need this temporary authorization?

Solvay Advanced Polymers, LLC (Solvay) is engaged primarily in the manufacture of engineered plastics for use as various types of containers, trays, and computer printer ink cartridges. From this activity, hazardous waste is generated. Once generated, these wastes are treated in a hazardous waste surface impoundment and stored in containers on-site. The Director originally issued a Hazardous Waste Facility Installation and Operation renewal Permit (Permit) to BP Amoco on August 7, 2001. BP Amoco Polymers, Inc. (BP Amoco) transferred ownership and operation of the facility to Solvay. BP Amoco requested a Class 3 Permit Modification to transfer the facility's Permit from BP Amoco to the new owner/operator, Solvay Advanced Polymer, L.L.C. On November 1, 2001, the Director authorized Solvay to temporarily conduct hazardous waste activities at the facility that otherwise would require a Permit until the Director acts on BP Amoco's request to transfer the Permit to Solvay. In today's action, the Director reissued the temporary authorization for an additional 180 days from April 30, 2002 (until October 27, 2002). On May 2, 2002, Ohio EPA issued a draft modified Permit to transfer the Permit from BP Amoco to Solvay. Can I appeal this temporary authorization?

Yes, if you are an officer of an agency of the state or of a political subdivision, acting in a representative capacity, or any person who would be aggrieved or adversely affected by this temporary authorization you have the right to appeal this decision to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission (ERAC) in accordance with Ohio Revised Code §§ 3745.04 or 3745.07.

If I decide to appeal this final temporary authorization, how and when must I make the appeal?

If you file an appeal, you must put it in writing no later than June 6, 2002. Your appeal must explain why you are appealing the action and the grounds you are using for your appeal. You must file your appeal with ERAC in accordance with Ohio Revised Code §§ 3745.04 or 3745.07 at the following address: **Environmental Review Appeals Commission**, 236 E. Town Street, Room 300, Columbus, Ohio 43215.
