NOTICE OF RECEIPT OF 401 APPLICATION AND PUBLIC HEARING**

Public notice is hereby given that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA) Division of Surface Water (DSW) has received an application for, and has begun to consider whether to issue or deny, a Clean Water Act Section 401 certification for a project impacting an intermittent stream in conjunction with the construction of an ethanol plant. The applicant's proposal could impact up to 2,000 linear feet of stream and 0.45 acres of wetland on site. The application was submitted by Greater Ohio Ethanol, LLC, 212 North Elizabeth St, Suite 203, Lima, Ohio 45801. The project is located north of Hanthorn Road and west of Interstate 75, in Lima, in Allen County. The Ohio EPA number for this project is 052245.

The discharges from these activities, if approved, would result in degradation to, or lowering of, the water quality of an unnamed tributary to Lost Creek, within the Auglaize River watershed (HUC 04100007). The review of the applications will be conducted, and a decision whether to grant or deny the applications will be made, in accordance with Chapters 3745-1 and 3745-32 of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC). In accordance with OAC 3745-1-05, an antidegradation review of the application will be conducted before deciding whether to allow a lowering of the water quality. Other alternatives resulting in lesser or no degradation or lowering of water quality, will be considered by Ohio EPA during the review process.

No exclusions or waivers, as outlined by Paragraph 3745-1-05 (D) of the Antidegradation Rule (effective as of July 1, 2003), apply or may be granted by the Director of Ohio EPA.

Beginning April 18, 2005, copies of the applications for the certifications and technical support information may be inspected at Ohio EPA-DSW, 122 S. Front Street, Columbus, Ohio 43215, by first calling (614) 644-2001. Applications can be made available at Ohio EPA Northwest District Office by calling the same number.

Ohio EPA will hold a public information session and public hearing relative to issues of lower water quality at 7:00 p.m. on June 2, 2005, at Lima City Hall, 50 Town Square, Lima, Ohio. The purpose of the hearing is to obtain additional information that will be considered by the director of Ohio EPA prior to any further action on the applications. All interested persons are entitled to attend or be represented and give oral or written comments on the proposed projects.

Ohio EPA will continue to accept written comments on the applications through the close of business on June 9, 2005. Comments received after this date may not be considered as part of the official record. ORC 3734.02(G) Exemption**

Pursuant to ORC Sections 3734.02(G), notice is hereby given on April 11, 2005, that the director of Ohio EPA issued Final Findings and Orders to Carbon Limestone Landfill, LLC, 8100 South Stateline Road, Lowellville, OH 44436, County Land Development Sanitary Landfill, LLC, 9960 South Range Road, Salem, OH 44460, County Environmental Landfill, LLC, 11164 County Highway #4, Carey, OH 43316, and Lorain County Landfill, LLC, 43502 Oberlin-Elyria Road, Oberlin, OH 44074 ("Respondents"). The landfill facilities (collectively the "Facilities") are each individually regarded as an "off -site facility" and are currently owned and operated by Browning-Ferris Industries of Ohio, Inc. ("BFI of Ohio, Inc."). The Respondents are hereby exempted from the requirement to file a disclosure statement at least 180 days prior to the date of the proposed change in ownership, as required in ORC Section 3734.42 (F)(1) and OAC Rule 109:6-1-02(A)(3), as a result of the proposed transfer of ownership of the Facilities described herein. The Respondent shall comply with all other applicable requirements of ORC Chapter 3734, and the rules adopted thereunder, as well as OAC Chapter 109:6-1. This exemption is subject to all rules, regulations, and specified conditions. Public notice is hereby given that on April 21, 2005 the Director of the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA) issued a proposed modification to the Ohio Power Company Muskingum River Plant National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit (01B00003) for the proposed treatment of wastewaters associated with the installation of selective catalytic reduction (SCR) technology on Unit 5 to comply with the Clean Air Act limitation for nitrogen emissions. The project is located on County Lane 32 (north 3.5 miles), Waterford Township, Washington County, and Center Township, Morgan County Ohio.

Ohio EPA has made a determination that the wastewater discharge from this proposed facility would result in degradation to or lowering of the water quality of No Name Creek and Millstone Creek. After considering the technical, economic, and social aspects of this project, the Director of the Ohio EPA has decided to make the preliminary determination to allow this degradation. However, the chemical-specific water quality standards developed to protect aquatic life and human health, set forth in Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) 3745-1, will not be exceeded.

In accordance with OAC 3745-1-05, Ohio EPA will provide an opportunity for public comment concerning this project. Comments received shall be considered by the Director before the permit modification issued as final. Any person may submit written comments on the proposed NPDES permit modification, and may request a public hearing. A request for public hearing shall be in writing and shall state the nature of the issues to be raised. Written comments and/or public hearing requests must be received by the Ohio EPA, Division of Surface Water no later than May 21, 2005. Comments received after this date may not be considered by the Director before issuing the final permit modification.
