Final Adoption of
Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) rules 3745-72-01, and OAC rule 3745-72-02

Notice is hereby given that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency, Division of Air Pollution Control (DAPC) will be adopting the following amended rules:

OAC rule 3745-72-01: Applicability
OAC rule 3745-72-02: Definitions

The amended rules are being adopted to address a shortfall in the full replacement of emission reductions required for the replacement of the "E-Check" program in the Cincinnati/Dayton metropolitan areas as a result of the lack of the low-RVP fuel program for the 2006 ozone season.

The anti-backsliding provisions of the eight-hour ozone implementation rule requires Ohio EPA to replace the emission reductions lost by the expiration of the E-Check program in the Cincinnati and Dayton areas on December 31, 2005. A planned replacement program, the low-RVP fuel program, will be unavailable for the 2006 ozone season. To replace the emission reductions lost through the unavailability of this program, Ohio EPA will permanently retire under-utilized new source NO_x set aside allowances (the right to emit emissions of NO_x) from the 2005 ozone season that would otherwise be returned to existing sources for the 2006 ozone season.

On April 24, 2006 emergency rules were adopted to amend OAC rules 3745-72-01 and 3745-72-02. The emergency rules modified the applicability date of the low RVP gasoline until twelve months after approval of the low RVP fuel program by the United States Environmental Protection Agency. The amended rules adopted herein make a permanent adoption of the emergency language.

In addition to the changes identified above, these rules also contain changes necessary to comply with ORC 121.72 which addresses incorporation of referenced materials.

A public hearing on the proposed amendments was held on June 2, 2006 in Columbus, Ohio. After considering comments and oral testimony, the Director's order of adoption was issued on July 7, 2006. The effective date of these rules is July 17, 2006.

Notice of Adoption of Rules**

Notice is hereby given that the Director of Environmental Protection, under the authority of Ohio Revised Code Section 3704.03(E) has adopted amended rule 3745-14-05, NOx allowance allocations.

The primary purpose of this rule making is to incorporate a new paragraph (C)(7) that resulted from necessity of retiring NOx allowances (the right to emit NOx) due to the unavailability of a planned replacement (low RVP fuel program) for the E-check (vehicle inspection program) in the Cincinnati and Dayton metropolitan areas.

The proposed rule language was filed as an emergency rule on April 24, 2006. A proposed permanent adoption package was filed simultaneously. Pursuant to Section 119.03 of the Ohio Revised Code, a public hearing on this rule change was conducted on June 2, 2006, in Columbus, Ohio and comments were received until the close of business that day. Comments on the rule were submitted by representatives of the electrical utility industry, the Ohio Manufacturer's Association, and the American Petroleum Institute.

The Director's order of adoption was issued on July 7, 2006. The effective date of these rules is July 17, 2006.

Public notice is hereby given that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Division of Air Pollution Control issued on December 13, 2002 a draft Federally Enforceable State Permit to Operate (FESOP) to Georgia-Pacific Resins, premise No. 0125040904. The major emission units in this draft FESOP are Plant No 1 and Plant No 2 for the production of urea-formaldehyde and each is vented to its own incinerator and two resin kettles K-1 and K-3 which is vented to a third incinerator. Each kettle is vented to an emergency containment system. All units are located at the Georgia-Pacific Resins facility at 1975 Watkins Road, Columbus, Ohio.

A public information session is scheduled for Tuesday, August 15, when Ohio EPA will give a short presentation on the permit followed by a question answer period. A public hearing is scheduled for the following Tuesday, August 22, 2006 when Ohio EPA will accept comments on the draft permit. A presiding officer will be present and may limit oral testimony to ensure that all parties are heard. Both meetings, August 15 and August 22 will be held from 6:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. at the Marion Franklin Recreation Center Auditorium, 2801 Lockbourne Road, Columbus, Ohio (Franklin County).

All interested persons are entitled to attend or be represented and give written or oral comments on the draft permit at the hearing. Written comments must be received by the Ohio EPA, Central District Office, Division of Air Pollution Control by the close of the business day of September 1, 2006. Comments received after this date will not be considered to be a part of the official record. OHIO EPA ISSUES FINAL CLASS 2 AND CLASS 3
HAZARDOUS WASTE PERMIT MODIFICATIONS**

On June 30, 2006, Ohio EPA issued final class 2 and class 3 hazardous waste facility installation and operation permit (Permit) modifications to U.S. DOE Miamisburg Closure Project (DOE Closure Project) for its facility at 1 Mound Road, Miamisburg, Ohio 45343. The EPA Identification Number for this facility is OH6890008984.

Why is DOE Closure Project modifying its Permit?

DOE Closure Project is a closed facility but was engaged primarily in the manufacture of detonators and other components for nuclear weapons. This activity resulted in the generation of various hazardous wastes. DOE Closure Project stores these hazardous wastes in two on-site storage units. DOE Closure Project is requesting a class 2 modification to remove references to active hazardous waste storage facilities from the Part B application as a result of certified closure of building 72 storage area and a class 3 modification to change the operator from BWXT of Ohio, Inc. to CH2MHill Mound, Inc. The permit has been modified to include a provision of Corrective Action only.

Can I appeal this final modified Permit?

Yes, if you are an officer of an agency of the state or of a political subdivision, acting in a representative capacity, or any person who would be aggrieved or adversely affected by this modified Permit, you have the right to appeal this Permit decision to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission (ERAC).

If I decide to appeal this final modified Permit, how and when must I make the appeal?

If you file an appeal, you must put it in writing no later than **August 7, 2006**. Your appeal must explain why you are appealing the action and the grounds you are using for your appeal. You must file your appeal, according to Ohio Revised Code §§ 3745.04 and 3745.07, with ERAC at the following address: ***Environmental Review Appeals Commission***, 309 South Fourth Street, Room 222, Columbus, Ohio 43215.
