Public notice is hereby given that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA) Division of Surface Water (DSW) has received an application for, and has begun to consider whether to issue or deny, a Clean Water Act Section 401 certification for construction of the proposed retail development project. The application was submitted by Select Strategies, LLC, 7250 Beechmont Avenue, Anderson Township, Ohio 45230. The project is located south of State Route 125 at Amelia-Olive Branch Road in Amelia, Clermont County, Ohio. Public notice is hereby given that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA) Division of Surface Water (DSW) has received an application for, and has begun to consider whether to issue or deny, a Clean Water Act Section 401 certification for a project to construct long term erosion protection and provide a protected beach area along the Lake Erie shoreline. The application was submitted by Ms. Ann Chapman, 19760 Frazier Drive, Rocky River, Ohio 44116. The project is located at 19760 Frazier Drive, Rocky River, Cuyahoga County, Ohio. The applicant's proposed preferred alternative, if approved, would construct a new 67 linear foot rubblemound detached breakwater, 55 linear feet of new armor stone revetment, 74 linear feet of new and rehabilitated armor stone revetment and a 20 foot by 25 foot concrete deck and seawall with access steel stairs. Total of 367 cubic yards of fill below OHW. The applicant's proposed minimal degradation alternative, if approved, would construct a new 60 linear foot rubblemound detached breakwater, 55 linear feet of new armor stone revetment, 74 linear feet of new and rehabilitated armor stone revetment and a 20 foot by 25 foot concrete deck and seawall with access steel stairs. Total of 347 cubic yards of fill below OHW. The applicant's proposed non-degradation alternative, if approved, would have no direct impacts on the lake.

The discharges from the activity, if approved, would result in degradation to, or lowering of, the water quality of Lake Erie. The review of the application will be conducted, and a decision whether to grant or deny the application will be made, in accordance with Chapters 3745-1 and 3745-32 of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC). In accordance with OAC 3745-1-05, an antidegradation review of the application will be conducted before deciding whether to allow a lowering of the water quality. Other alternatives resulting in lesser or no degradation or lowering of water quality, will be considered by Ohio EPA during the review process.

No exclusions or waivers, as outlined by Paragraph 3745-1-05 (D) of the Antidegradation Rule (effective as of May 1, 1998), apply or may be granted by the Director of Ohio EPA.

OHIO EPA ISSUES FINAL MODIFICATION TO HAZARDOUS WASTE PERMIT

On December 5, 2006, Ohio EPA issued a final modified hazardous waste facility installation and operation permit (Permit) for the Austin Powder Company (Austin Powder). The facility is located at 430 Powder Plant Road, McArthur, Ohio 45651. The EPA Identification Number for this facility is OHD004293775.

Why does Austin Powder need a Permit modification?

Austin Powder manufactures explosives for use primarily in the mining industry. The Director of Ohio EPA is initiating this modification to revise the permit terms and conditions to incorporate site-wide corrective measures implementation. Based upon review of the Corrective Measures Study Final Report, the Director has determined that the remedies already performed by Austin Powder Company constitute completion of Corrective Measures at the facility, and that no further action be taken. To issue this final modified permit, Ohio EPA determined that the completed corrective measures meet appropriate standards.

Can I appeal this modified permit?

Yes, if you are an officer of an agency of the state or of a political subdivision, acting in a representative capacity, or any person who would be aggrieved or adversely affected by this Permit, you have the right to appeal this permit decision to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission (ERAC).

If I decide to appeal this final modified Permit, how and when must I make the appeal?

If you file an appeal, you must put it in writing no later than January 5, 2007. Your appeal must explain why you are appealing the action and the grounds you are using for your appeal. The appeal must be accompanied by a filing fee of \$70.00 which the Commission, in its discretion, may reduce if by affidavit you demonstrate that payment of the full amount of the fee would cause extreme hardship. Ohio EPA requests that a copy of the appeal be served upon the Ohio Attorney General's Office, Environmental Enforcement Section.
