NOTICE OF RECEIPT OF 401 APPLICATION**

Public notice is hereby given that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA) Division of Surface Water (DSW) has received an application for, and has begun to consider whether to issue or deny, a Clean Water Act Section 401 water quality certification for a project that involves surface coal mining in Gallia County, Ohio. The coal mining operations will be authorized by the Ohio Department of Natural Resources, Division of Mineral Resources Management (application number 10340). The total "Strip Area" proposed is 17.20-acres and is projected to yield 156,000 tonnage of coal. The application was submitted by Leroy Collier, 4881 Gallia Street, Portsmouth, Ohio 45662. The project is located at Sections 13 and 14 in Township 6 North, Range 12 West, Greenfield Township, Gallia County, Ohio. The Huntington District Corps of Engineers Public Notice Number for this project is 2005-01265-OHR. The Ohio EPA ID Number for this project is 093588.

As required by the Antidegradation Rule, rule 3745-1-05 of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC), three alternatives have been submitted for the project. The applicant's proposed preferred alternative, if approved, would impact 2,698.5 linear feet of streams by mine through, construction of haul roads, and the construction of sediment ponds. No wetlands will be affected by the preferred alternative. The applicant's proposed minimal degradation alternative, if approved, would impact 1,170.5 linear feet of streams by mine through, construction of haul roads, and the construction of sediment ponds. No wetlands will be affected by the minimal degradation alternative. The applicant's proposed non-degradation alternative, if approved, would have no direct impacts on waters of the state.

Discharges from the activity, if approved, would result in degradation to, or lowering of, the water quality of un-named tributaries to Symmes Creek. Ohio EPA will review the application, and decide whether to grant or deny the application, in accordance with OAC Chapters 3745-1 and 3745-32. In accordance with OAC rule 3745-1-05, an antidegradation review of the application will be conducted before deciding whether to allow a lowering of water quality. All three proposed alternatives will be considered during the review process. No exclusions or waivers, as outlined by OAC rule 3745-1-05, apply or may be granted.

NOTICE OF RECEIPT OF APPLICATION AND PUBLIC HEARING
ANTIDegradation**

Public notice is hereby given that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA)-Division of Surface Water (DSW) has received an application for the renewal of a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit (4PF00001) for the discharges from the DuPont Circleville Ohio Plant. The NPDES application was submitted by E.I du Pont de Nemours & Company, P.O. Box 89, Circleville, Ohio 43113.

The DuPont Circleville Plant proposes to install a new Tedlar polyvinyl fluoride film production line. The wastewater associated with this facility will be a new source of wastewater not currently covered under the existing NPDES permit for the facility. The proposed project is located at 800 DuPont Road, Circleville, Pickaway County, Ohio. The proposed discharges are to the Scioto River at river mile 95.9.

Other wastewater disposal alternatives resulting in lesser or no degradation or lowering of water quality will be considered by Ohio EPA.

The discharges from the project, if approved, would result in degradation to, or lowering of, the water quality of the Scioto River. However, the chemical-specific water quality criteria developed to protect aquatic life and human health, set forth in OAC 3745-1, will not be exceeded. In accordance with OAC 3745-1-05, an antidegradation review of the application will be conducted before deciding whether to allow a lowering of the water quality.

Copies of the pending NPDES application are available for review at Ohio EPA's Central District Office, 50 West Town Street, 5th Floor, Columbus, Ohio 43215 (614) 728-3778. An Ohio EPA public hearing on the proposed project has been scheduled for 6:00 P.M. on February 17, 2010, at the Pickaway County Library, 1160 North Court Street, Circleville, Ohio 43113. The public hearing will end when everyone in attendance has had an opportunity to provide testimony related to the project.

All interested persons are entitled to attend or be represented and give written or oral comments on the project. The purpose of the hearing is to obtain additional information that will be considered by the director of Ohio EPA prior to any further action on the application.
