Notice of Rescission of Rules**

Notice is hereby given that the Director of Environmental Protection, under the authority of Ohio Revised Code Section 3704.03 has rescinded the rules of Chapter 3745-108 of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC), Ohio's Clean Air Mercury Rules (CAMR) program.

The primary purpose of this rulemaking is to rescind Ohio's CAMR program. It has recently become apparent that USEPA is cancelling the federal CAMR program and replacing it with alternate standards. Without the federal program, Ohio's CAMR program (OAC Chapter 3745-108) cannot be enforced and is, therefore, unnecessary.

Pursuant to Section 121.39 of the Ohio Revised Code, DAPC is required to consult with interested parties affected by the rules before the division formally adopts them. On October 23, 2009, these rules went out for a 30 day review by interested parties. Pursuant to Section 119.03 of the Ohio Revised Code, a public hearing on these rule changes was conducted on March 12, 2010, in Columbus, Ohio. There was one comment received in support of the Chapter's rescission, which did not result in changes to the rules proposed. The Director's order of adoption was issued on April 9, 2010. The effective date of these rules is April 19, 2010.

This action of the Director is final and may be appealed to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission ("ERAC") pursuant to Section 3745.04 of the Ohio Revised Code. The appeal must be in writing and set forth the action complained of and the grounds upon which the appeal is based. The appeal must be filed with ERAC within thirty (30) days after notice of the Director's action, at 309 South Fourth Street, Suite 222, Columbus, Ohio 43215. Copies of the appeal must be served upon the Director of the Ohio EPA within three (3) days of filing with ERAC. The appeal must be accompanied by a filing fee of \$70.00 which the Commission, in its discretion, may reduce if by affidavit you demonstrate that payment of the full amount of the fee would cause extreme hardship. Ohio EPA also requests that a copy of the appeal be served upon the Environmental Enforcement Section of the Ohio Attorney General's Office.

**Purpose of rule-making.** The primary purpose of this proposed rule-making is to adopt rules consistent with and equivalent to regulations adopted by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (U.S. EPA) pursuant to the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA). <p>* Please note that Ohio EPA is not addressing all of the regulatory components of this particular federal rule-making; we are not proposing some components at this time. The federal rules amended by this FR are so many that we're breaking up Ohio's adoption of the corrections into a number of rule-makings over several years. This is the second portion of the Corrections rule to be addressed in Ohio rule-making.</p>	

Several of these proposed Ohio rules are amended to address cross-referencing requirements within rules, and to correct typographical errors and rule structure errors (indenting, spacing). This proposal includes corrections and clarifications that are not directly included in the federal hazardous waste rules, but which are necessary to the Ohio rules to maintain the internal consistency (in wording, references, and format) of the Ohio hazardous waste management program. Several rules contain state-initiated amendments designed to clarify requirements regarding recycled materials. Many of these rules were also reviewed and amended pursuant to Ohio Revised Code (ORC) section 119.032, which requires Ohio EPA to review certain rules every five years.

**A public hearing** pursuant to ORC sections 119.02 through 119.04 will be conducted

on Thursday, May 20, 2010 at 1:00 p.m. in conference center room C at the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency, Lazarus Government Center, 50 West Town Street, Suite 700, Columbus, Ohio. All interested parties are entitled to attend or be represented and give their written or verbal comments on this proposed rule-making. A presiding officer will be present until 2:00 p.m. or until all interested parties have been heard if that time interval is insufficient.

**If you plan to attend the hearing**, please be aware that all visitors to Ohio EPA must register at the security desk in the lobby upon arrival. Please bring photo identification (e.g., a valid driver's license); it is a requirement for building admittance. For security reasons, visitors are required to wear their badge at all times while in the building. Please arrive early to complete security procedures.

**To give notice of intent to provide verbal comments at the public hearing**, please contact Kit Arthur; her contact information is at the end of this notice. To facilitate scheduling of verbal presentations, people who intend to give testimony at the hearing should ensure that Ohio EPA receives notice of such intent by 5:00 p.m. on Wednesday, May 19, 2010. People who provide Ohio EPA with prior notice will be heard before those who register at the hearing.

**Comment due date.** In order to assure that written communications are considered as part of the official record of this hearing, written communications must be received by Ohio EPA by 5:00 p.m. on Thursday, May 20, 2010. Written communications may be filed with the presiding officer during the hearing, or provided via U.S. mail or email to Kit Arthur. Your emailed comments on these rules are welcome, but *must* include the sender's name and phone number in order to be verified and considered.

### **Ohio EPA Approves a Modification of an Authorization to Fill, Grade, Excavate, Build, Drill or Mine the Landfill at Gowdy North Property, Columbus, Ohio**

On April 16, 2010, the Director of Ohio EPA issued a modification to an August 14, 2009 Ohio Administrative Code 3745-27-13 authorization. The August 2009 authorization addressed filling, grading, excavating, building, drilling or mining activities at the Gowdy North Property located at 681 West 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue, Columbus, Franklin County, Ohio. Specifically, the August 2009 authorization addressed medical building construction with associated activities and improvements. This request was required because the property is part of a landfill, known as the Gowdy Field Landfill, which was operated by the city of Columbus between 1950 and 1969.

The modification of the August 2009 authorization addressed filling, grading, excavating, building, drilling or mining activities at the Gowdy North Property to construct an addition to the medical building.

You are hereby notified that this action of the Director is final and may be appealed to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 3745.04. The appeal must be in writing and set forth the action complained of and the grounds upon which the appeal is based. The appeal must be filed with the Commission within 30 days after notice of the Director's action. The appeal must be accompanied by a filing fee of \$70.00, made payable to "Ohio Treasurer Kevin Boyce," which the Commission, in its discretion, may reduce if by affidavit you demonstrate that payment of the full amount of the fee would cause extreme hardship. Notice of the filing of the appeal shall be filed with the Director within three days of filing with the Commission. Ohio EPA requests that a copy of the appeal be served upon the Ohio Attorney General's Office, Environmental Enforcement Section.
