OHIO EPA ISSUES EMERGENCY PERMIT TO
HERITAGE-WTI, INC.**

On August 4, 2010, Ohio EPA issued an emergency permit to Heritage - WTI, Inc. to temporarily store on-site an additional 165,000 gallons of containerized hazardous waste in the 1) Drum Warehouse of the Container Processing building; and 2) 90-Day North & East generator storage areas. This emergency permit is necessary as a result of an unexpected shut down of the facility's hazardous waste incinerator to repair a ruptured boiler tube. This emergency permit expires on August 19, 2010. The Ohio EPA emergency permit I.D. number assigned to this action is 02-15-1031E.

This final action was not preceded by a proposed action and is appealable to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission.

NOTICE OF RECEIPT OF 401 APPLICATION**

Public notice is hereby given that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA) Division of Surface Water (DSW) has received an application for, and has begun to consider whether to issue or deny, a Clean Water Act Section 401 water quality certification for a project to construct a recreational trail to connect Eyman Park with the Fayette County YMCA facility. The application was submitted by the City of Washington Court House. The project is located at along the southwest side of Paint Creek, the northeast side of a railroad track, and northwest of Eyman Park. The Huntington District Corps of Engineers Public Notice Number for this project is LRH-2009-601. The Ohio EPA ID Number for this project is 103622.

As required by the Antidegradation Rule, rule 3745-1-05 of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC), three alternatives have been submitted for the project. The applicant's proposed preferred alternative, if approved, would consist of the placement of 13,400 cubic yards of fill and result in impacts to approximately 2.45 acres of forested, Category 2 wetlands. It would create a recreational trail on top of approximately 5 feet of fill.

The applicant's proposed minimal degradation alternative, if approved, would consist of the placement of 1,300 cubic yards of fill and result in impacts to approximately 1.2 acres of forested, Category 2 wetlands. Only fill needed for leveling the recreational trail would be placed in the wetland.

The applicant's proposed non-degradation alternative is to not construct the recreational trail.

Discharges from the activity, if approved, would result in degradation to, or lowering of, the water quality of a forested Category 2 wetland along Paint Creek, a warmwater habitat stream. Ohio EPA will review the application, and decide whether to grant or deny the application, in accordance with OAC Chapters 3745-1 and 3745-32. In accordance with OAC rule 3745-1-05, an antidegradation review of the application will be conducted before deciding whether to allow a lowering of water quality. All three proposed alternatives will be considered during the review process. No exclusions or waivers, as outlined by OAC rule 3745-1-05, apply or may be granted.

NOTICE OF RECEIPT OF 401 APPLICATION**

Public notice is hereby given that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA) Division of Surface Water (DSW) has received an application for, and has begun to consider whether to issue or deny, a Clean Water Act Section 401 water quality certification for a project to construct a new storm sewer system to eliminate flooding events and in the watershed while maintaining base flow in the channel. The application was submitted by the City of Toledo. The project is located at Peterson Ditch between Interstate 475 and Middlesex Drive in the City of Toledo, Lucas County. The Ohio EPA ID Number for this project is 103635.

As required by the Antidegradation Rule, rule 3745-1-05 of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC), three alternatives have been submitted for the project. The applicant's proposed preferred alternative, if approved, would discharge 40 cubic yards of fill below the ordinary high watermark of Peterson Ditch for culvert and backfill between Haughton and Wendover Drives and discharge 13.3 cubic yards of fill in Peterson Ditch at Grove Patterson Park for 12" diameter orifice pipe impacting a total of 328 linear feet of Peterson Ditch. The applicant's proposed minimal degradation alternative, if approved, would discharge fill to 193 linear feet of Peterson ditch between Haughton and Wendover Drives. The applicant's proposed non-degradation alternative, if approved, would have no direct impacts on waters of the state.

Discharges from the activity, if approved, would result in degradation to, or lowering of, the water quality of Peterson Ditch which ultimately discharges into the Ottawa River. Ohio EPA will review the application, and decide whether to grant or deny the application, in accordance with OAC Chapters 3745-1 and 3745-32. In accordance with OAC rule 3745-1-05, an antidegradation review of the application will be conducted before deciding whether to allow a lowering of water quality. All three proposed alternatives will be considered during the review process. No exclusions or waivers, as outlined by OAC rule 3745-1-05, apply or may be granted.

NOTICE OF RECEIPT OF ISOLATED WETLAND PERMIT
APPLICATION (LEVEL 2)**

Public notice is hereby given that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA) Division of Surface Water (DSW) has received an application for, and has begun to consider whether to issue or deny, an Isolated Wetland Permit (Level 2) for a project to construct South Airfield Road, install sanitary sewer and water lines, improve Whitehouse-Spencer Road for the development of an industrial park on the 166 acres of currently undeveloped land. The project would result in the impact to 0.899 acres of Category 1 and Category 2 Isolated wetlands. Additional impacts to jurisdictional wetlands and waters will be reviewed through the 401 Water Quality Certification application process. The application was submitted by the Toledo-Lucas County Port Authority. The project is located north of Alternate US 20, East of Air Cargo Parkway, and west of Whitehouse-Spencer Road, in Swanton Township, Lucas County, Ohio. The Ohio EPA Number for this project is 103641.

The review of the application will be conducted, and a decision whether to grant or deny the application will be made, in accordance with Ohio Revised Code (ORC) Sections 6111.02 to 6111.028 and other applicable provisions of state laws. Other alternatives as proposed by the applicant resulting in less adverse impact to the isolated wetland ecosystem, will be considered by Ohio EPA during the review process.

OHIO EPA RECEIVES NEW HAZARDOUS WASTE CLOSURE PLAN

On July 26, 2010, Ohio EPA received a new hazardous waste closure plan from the United States Enrichment Corporation-(U.S. Enrichment) for its tank storage area located at 3930 State Route 23 South, Piketon, Ohio 45661. The EPA Identification Number for this facility is OHD987054723.

Why is U.S. Enrichment Submitting this New Closure Plan?

At the request of Ohio EPA, U.S. Enrichment submitted this new closure plan. This closure plan addresses storage tank numbers 1, 2, 3 & 4, known as area X-700 Clean Tank. The plan is intended to minimize the need for further maintenance of the X-700 storage area. It also describes the amount of waste removed from each tank, decontamination of tank outer surfaces and floor, closure cost, closure schedule and certification, and other related topics.
