COVENANT NOT TO SUE / FINAL FINDINGS AND ORDERS
Swan Super Cleaners / Former Swan Cleaners Store # 49

Notice is hereby given that on November 19, 2010, the Director of the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA), pursuant to Ohio Revised Code (ORC) Chapter 3746 and Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) Chapter 3745-300, issued a covenant not to sue / final findings and orders to Swan Super Cleaners for property known as Former Swan Cleaners Store # 49.

Swan Super Cleaners conducted a voluntary action of the approximately 0.039-acre property, located at 1361 Worthington Centre Drive, Columbus, Franklin County, Ohio. A no further action letter for the property was issued on February 25, 2009 and submitted on March 2, 2009 to the Voluntary Action Program of the Ohio EPA Division of Emergency and Remedial Response by Ronald J. Wells, a certified professional (No. CP 314), as defined in ORC 3746.01(F) and OAC 3745-300-01(A).

This action of the Director is final and may be appealed to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission pursuant to ORC 3745.04. The appeal must be in writing and set forth the action complained of and the grounds upon which the appeal is based. The appeal must be filed with the Commission within 30 days after notice of the action. The appeal must be accompanied by a filing fee of \$70.00, made payable to "Ohio Treasurer Kevin Boyce," which the Commission, in its discretion, may reduce if by affidavit it is demonstrated that payment of the full amount of the fee would cause extreme hardship. Notice of the filing of the appeal shall be filed with the Director within three days of filing with the Commission. Notice is hereby given that on November 22, 2010, the Director of the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency ("Ohio EPA"), pursuant to Ohio Revised Code ("ORC") 3746.04(B)(6) and Ohio Administrative Code ("OAC") 3745-300-04, issued additional certification to Pace Analytical Services ("Pace") to perform analyses for several analytes using TO15-modified. The certification number assigned to Pace remains CL101.

This action of the Director is final and may be appealed to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission (the "Commission") pursuant to ORC Section 3745.04. The appeal must be in writing and set forth the action complained of and the grounds upon which the appeal is based. The appeal must be filed with the Commission within thirty (30) days after notice of the action. The appeal must be accompanied by a filing fee of \$70.00, made payable to "Ohio Treasurer Kevin Boyce," which the Commission, in its discretion, may reduce if by affidavit it is demonstrated that payment of the full amount of the fee would cause extreme hardship. PUBLIC NOTICE

On the basis of preliminary staff review and application of standards and regulations, the Director of the Ohio EPA is public noticing a draft permit that regulates storm water discharges from the City of Akron municipal separate storm sewer system (MS4) to surface waters of the state on November 29, 2010. The draft permit will be issued as a final action unless the Director revises it after consideration of comments made in writing or at a public meeting, or upon disapproval by the Administrator of the United States Environmental Protection Agency. Any person may submit written comments on the draft permit for the administrative record. A public meeting may be held to explain the content of the permit and its applicability. The date, time and location of the public meeting will be public noticed if one is to be held.

The permit affords coverage to all areas within the corporate boundary of the City of Akron served by its MS4 and authorizes existing or new storm water point source discharges to surface waters of the State from the MS4. The permit contains requirements for a storm water management program to reduce pollutant discharges from the MS4. The permit also contains monitoring requirements to identify the impact of the discharges from the MS4 on water bodies and to assess the effectiveness of the storm water management program.

Interested persons are invited to submit written comments on the permit. Comments should be submitted no later than 30 days after the date of this public notice. Deliver or mail all comments to:

**Ohio EPA Finalizes Decision Document
For the Green I Landfill Site, Logan, Ohio**

On November 22, 2010, the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) finalized a Decision Document identifying the selected alternative to remediate contamination at the Green I Landfill Site located on Hunters Woods Road in Green Township (Logan), Hocking County, Ohio.

The approximately 10½ acre Green I Landfill began operations in 1970 and ceased accepting waste in 1974. The landfill accepted household, commercial and industrial wastes. Information generated during the remedial investigation and feasibility study and modified based on public comments was used to select the remedial alternative for the Site, which includes: construction of a multi-layer cap; installation of a leachate (*i.e.*, water that has come into contact with buried landfill wastes) collection system; dewatering and removal of sediments from an affected off-site pond; an environmental covenant establishing activity and use limitations for the Site property; and associated reporting.

On February 9, 2010, Ohio EPA issued a Preferred Plan that outlined Ohio EPA's preferred alternative to remediate contamination at the Site. A public meeting was held March 4, 2010, during which public comments on the Preferred Plan were accepted. In addition, written comments on the Preferred Plan were accepted through April 19, 2010. The comments received by the Agency during the comment period are addressed in the Responsiveness Summary attached to the Decision Document.
