

Notice: Availability of Draft Rules for Comment
New and Amended Draft Rules in OAC Chapters 3750-1, 3750-15, 3750-25,
3750-30, and 3750-50.

The Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (OEPA) Division of Air Pollution Control (DAPC) and the State Emergency Response Commission (SERC) have reviewed rules contained in Chapters 3750-1, 3750-15, 3750-25, 3750-30, and 3750-50 of the Administrative Code (OAC). The primary purpose of the review is to satisfy the requirements of ORC 119.032 (five-year review) and to ensure that SERC rules continue to be consistent with and equivalent in scope, content, and coverage with the Federal Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-know Act (EPCRA).

Based on our review, the SERC has determined that these rules continue to be necessary and are in need of some minor changes. The changes to these rules consist primarily of minor corrections, formatting changes and correcting language inadvertently omitted during previous rulemakings. DAPC and the SERC have also updated information in these rules regarding referenced materials.

As part of the rulemaking process, DAPC is required by Section 121.39 of the Ohio Revised Code to consult with organizations that represent political subdivisions, environmental interests, business interests, and others affected by the rules. The DAPC is offering your organization the opportunity to comment on these rules before the Division formally proposes them.

SCIOTO BRUSH CREEK WATERSHED
TOTAL MAXIMUM DAILY LOAD REPORT**

Public notice is hereby given that the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA) Division of Surface Water (DSW) is providing for public review and comment the Scioto Brush Creek Watershed Total Maximum Daily Load Report (TMDL) Document. Ohio EPA developed the Document in fulfillment of Section 303(d) of the Clean Water Act, which requires the identification of impaired waterbodies for which technology-based effluent limitations are not stringent enough to achieve applicable water quality standards and to develop Total Maximum Daily Loads for such waters. The Document addresses impairments in the Scioto Brush Creek watershed that appear on the Ohio 2010 303(d) list (assessment units 05060002 14 01 through 06 and 05060002 15 01 through 07). The impaired waters are located in Adams and Scioto counties.

All interested persons wishing to submit comments for Ohio EPA's consideration may do so in writing to Ohio EPA, Division of Surface Water, P.O. Model General Air Permits Available for Application

Notice is hereby given that the Director of Environmental Protection (“Ohio EPA”) is making available for application through the Division of Air Pollution Control (“DAPC”) twelve model general permits-to-install and operate (“MGPTIO”) for stationary compression ignition (diesel) internal combustion engines. Ohio EPA provided a 30-day comment period on the draft MGPTI and MGPTIO terms and conditions beginning on October 29, 2010. After considering all comments received, Ohio EPA developed the final MGPTIOs and will begin accepting applications on April 26, 2011.

The Ohio EPA, DAPC general permit program is regulated under Ohio Administrative Code (“OAC”) 3745-31-29. This notice is being issued in order to fulfill the requirements of OAC Rule 3745-31-29(A)(3). Alternative Infectious Waste Treatment Technology Approval

Notice is hereby given that on April 26, 2011, the director of Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (OEPA) granted statewide approval of The Tissue Digester™ as an alternative infectious waste treatment technology for BioSAFE Engineering, LLC, 485 Southpoint Circle, Ste 200, Brownsburg, IN 46112. BioSAFE Engineering, LLC and the owner or operator of each installed unit must conform to the stated conditions. This approval is subject to all rules, regulations, and specified conditions. This final action was not preceded by a proposed action and is appealable to the Environmental Review Appeals Commission pursuant to Section 3745.04 of the Ohio Revised Code.

The appeal must be in writing and set forth the action complained of and the grounds upon which the appeal is based. The appeal must be filed with the Commission within thirty (30) days after notice of the Directors action. The appeal must be accompanied by a filing fee of \$70.00 which the Commission, in its discretion, may reduce if by affidavit you demonstrate that payment of the full amount of the fee would cause extreme hardship. Notice of the filing of the appeal shall be filed with the Director within three (3) days of filing with the Commission. Ohio EPA requests that a copy of the appeal be served upon the Ohio Attorney General's Office Environmental Enforcement Section.
