**OAC Chapter 3745-31, "Permits-to-Install New Sources and Permit-to-Install and Operate Program"**

Notice is hereby given that in accordance with Ohio Revised Code (ORC) 119.032 (5-year rule review), the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency, Division of Air Pollution Control (DAPC) has reviewed the rules contained in Ohio Administrative Code (OAC) chapter 3745-31. These rules govern the Permits-to-Install New Sources and Permit-to-Install and Operate Program. Our preliminary review indicates that these rules continue to be necessary and that amendment of some of the rules in this chapter is necessary.

Amendments are being made to rules 3745-31-01, 3745-31-02, 3745-31-04, 3745-31-06, 3745-31-07, 3745-31-08, 3745-31-09, 3745-31-10, 3745-31-11, 3745-31-12, 3745-31-13, 3745-31-14, 3745-31-15, 3745-31-16, 3745-31-17, 3745-31-18, 3745-31-19, 3745-31-20, 3745-31-21, 3745-31-22, 3745-31-23, 3745-31-24, 3745-31-25, 3745-31-26, 3745-31-27, 3745-31-28, 3745-31-29 and 3745-31-32 to bring the rules in line with federal requirements, to correct minor typographical errors, to fulfill the formatting requirements of the Legislative Services commission (LSC), and to add and update citation information on materials referenced in these rules. Rules 3745-31-30 and 3745-31-31 are being removed from this chapter. Specific information on the amendments to these rules can be found in the rule synopsis document, available electronically at the URL listed at the end of this notice.

Pursuant to Section 121.39 of the Ohio Revised Code, DAPC was required to consult with interested parties affected by the rules before the division formally proposes them. On April 23, 2013, these rules went out for a 30 day review by interested parties. Ohio EPA received several comments on the draft rule language.

Pursuant to Section 119.03 of the Ohio Revised Code, a public hearing on these rule changes will be conducted on **Tuesday, February 18, 2014 at 10:30 AM** at Ohio EPA, Lazarus Government Center, 50 W. All interested persons are entitled to attend or be represented at the hearing and give written or oral comments on these rule changes. Written statements submitted after February 18, 2014, may be considered as time and circumstances permit, but will not be part of the official record of the hearing.

Notice is hereby given that the Director of Environmental Protection, under the authority of Sections 6111.03, 6111.04, 6111.44, 6111.45 and 6111.46 of the Ohio Revised Code and in accordance with Chapter 119. of the Ohio Revised Code, proposes to adopt amendments to the following rules of the Ohio Administrative Code (OAC):

OAC Chapter 3745-11 contains the administrative procedures for the Director's issuance of connection bans. Section 119.032 of the Ohio Revised Code requires Ohio EPA to review its rules every five years to determine whether they should be changed. The Agency has reviewed these connection ban standards rules and has identified needed changes.

The public comment period will run until **5:00 p.m. on February 10, 2014**. A public hearing on these proposed rule amendments will be held to consider public comments in accordance with Section 119.03 of the Ohio Revised Code. This hearing will be held in **Lazarus Conference Center, Room A at the Ohio EPA Central Office, 50 West Town Street, Suite 700, Columbus, Ohio at 2:00 p.m. on February 10, 2014**. All visitors to Ohio EPA must register at the Security desk in the lobby upon arrival. Please bring photo identification (such as a valid driver's license). For security reasons, visitors are required to wear their badge at all times while in the building. Please arrive early to complete these procedures.

To facilitate the scheduling of oral presentations, persons intending to give testimony at the hearing should notify the Ohio EPA Public Interest Center, P.O. Box 1049, Columbus, Ohio 43216-1049, (614) 644-2160. Prior registration will ensure that registrants are heard ahead of those individuals who register at the hearing. Oral testimony may be limited to five minutes, depending on the number of persons testifying. All interested persons are entitled to attend or be represented and to present oral and/or written comments concerning the proposed rules.

In accordance with OAC rule 3745-1-05, an antidegradation review of the application will be conducted before deciding whether to allow a lowering of water quality. Discharges from the activity, if approved, would result in degradation to, or lowering of, the water quality of Lake Erie. Ohio EPA will review the application, and decide whether to grant or deny the application, in accordance with OAC Chapters 3745-1 and 3745-32. In accordance with OAC rule 3745-1-05, an antidegradation review of the application will be conducted before deciding whether to allow a lowering of water quality.
