PROPOSED CONSENT ORDER**

The Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA) and Northridge Music Center, LTD., et al., (“Defendants”) have entered into a proposed Consent Order to resolve the Complaint filed in the Ashtabula County Court of Common Pleas, Case Number 2012CV0518. The Complaint alleged that Defendants illegally discharged untreated and improperly treated sewage to waters of the state and caused pollution without having a legally effective permit. The Complaint also alleged that Defendants created and maintained a public nuisance, and commenced the modification of a disposal system without first obtaining a Permit to Install from the Director. The proposed Consent Order requires the Defendants install an alarm on their septic tank and pump when necessary. In addition, the proposed Consent Order requires Defendants to comply with all applicable provisions of R.C. Chapter 6111, and pay a civil penalty of twelve thousand five hundred dollars (\$12,500).

**Ohio EPA Issues Modified Decision Document**

On September 9, 2014, the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA) issued a Modification to the September 10, 2012 Decision Document (2012 Decision Document) concerning the King Road Landfill site located at 3535 King Road, Sylvania, Lucas County, Ohio (Site). The Modified Decision Document identifies the modifications to the selected alternative to remediate contamination at the Site, and the rationale for the modifications.

The King Road Landfill began waste disposal operations in 1954 and ceased them in 1976, resulting in a waste disposal area of approximately 70 acres. From 1980 through 1991, a transfer station was operated near the main gate on King Road. Based on the information identified during the remedial investigation and feasibility study, the selected remedial alternative for the Site included: a vegetated landfill cap; maintenance of the landfill cap; site access, and engineering and institutional controls; ditch sediment hot spot removal; establishing a “no well zone” in the area around the landfill by the Lucas County Board of Health; ground water monitoring; and, continued operation of the existing leachate collection and pump station, and methane gas monitoring.

Ohio EPA issued a Preferred Plan for the remediation of this Site on April 16, 2009. On the same date, Ohio EPA issued Directors Final Findings and Orders (Orders), pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 3734.02(G), exempting the Lucas County Commissioners from the requirement to construct a composite cap system in accordance with OAC Rule 3745-27-11(G), as was described in the April 16, 2009 Preferred Plan. Based on the comments received on the April 16, 2009 Preferred Plan, and on the issuance of the April 16, 2009 Orders, Ohio EPA issued a revised Preferred Plan on November 29, 2010. Ohio EPA then issued the 2012 Decision Document, which was appealed to the Environmental Review and Appeals Commission (ERAC) in October 2012.

Subsequent to the issuance of the 2012 Decision Document and the associated ERAC appeal, information was provided to the Agency documenting the acceptable closure in 1969 of an approximately 43 acre portion of the nearly 70 acre King Road Landfill. The thickness of the soil cover on the remaining 27 acre portion of the landfill was evaluated in June 2013. The resulting July 5, 2013 report indicates that the remedy will require the installation of additional soil cover on only about one acre located at the southwest corner of the western end of the landfill. Additional information was also provided to the Agency with regard to “hot spot” ditch sediments and the groundwater no well zone, which resulted in modifications and updates to the selected remedial alternative in the 2012 Decision Document.

Ohio EPA Issues Decision Document for  
Hilltop Landfill, Ellsworth Township, Ohio**

On September 10, 2014, Ohio EPA finalized a Decision Document identifying the selected alternative to remediate contamination at the Hilltop Landfill site (site) located north of U.S. Route 224 in Ellsworth Township (approximately 1.5 miles west of Canfield), Mahoning County, Ohio. The Decision Document summarizes the history of, and the investigation into contamination at the site, provides an analysis of the feasibility of remedial alternatives, and outlines Ohio EPA's selected alternative for remediation.

The Hilltop Landfill (aka Old Toth Landfill) is located on approximately 20 acres and was formerly a coal strip mine. The landfill operated between 1969 and 1976 and accepted household, commercial, agricultural, light industrial, institutional and construction wastes. Contaminants include ammonia, volatile organic compounds and semi-volatile organic compounds (including pesticides). Contamination in the form of leachate seeps is also entering a nearby unnamed creek.

The major components of the preferred remedial alternative include: landfill cover improvements, leachate collection system enhancements and associated long-term operation and maintenance, ground water monitoring, and activity and use limitations through an environmental covenant for the property related to site ground water and soil gas issues.

On April 14, 2014, Ohio EPA issued a Preferred Plan that outlined Ohio EPA's preferred alternative to remediate contamination at the site. A public meeting was held May 29, 2014, during which no public comments on the Preferred Plan were submitted. In addition, written comments on the Preferred Plan were accepted through June 6, 2014. The comments received by the Agency during the comment period are addressed in the Response to Comments Section included in the Decision Document.
