The draft changes were made after a review to fulfill the requirements of ORC 119.032 (5-year review).

DAPC is suggesting to amend the following OAC rules: OAC rule 3745-26-01, OAC rule 3745-26-10, OAC rule 3745-26-12, OAC rule 3745-26-13, OAC rule 3745-26-14, OAC rule 3745-26-15, OAC rule 3745-26-16.

As part of the rule-making process, DAPC is required by Section 121.39 of the Ohio Revised Code to consult with organizations that represent political subdivisions, environmental interests, business interests, and others affected by the rules. The DAPC is offering your organization the opportunity to comment on these rules before the division formally proposes them.

These permits have been issued in final form by the Director pursuant to Section 6111.044 of the Ohio Revised Code and Chapter 3745-34 of the Ohio Administrative Code.

This final action was preceded by a draft action issued July 22, 2014. Ohio EPA sponsored a public information session and public meeting on August 26, 2014.
