


## Cuyahoga County Board of Health Stormwater Program

- 2000 - member of NE Ohio Stormwater Task Force
  - Developed comprehensive IDDE program, began 2003
  - Author of the IDDE Guidance Manual for Ohio
  - Worked on the model Illicit discharge ordinance for NE Ohio

- ### CCBH Storm Water Program Activities
- MS4 Outfall Inventory
  - Dry Weather Inspections/Sampling
  - Source Tracking for Illicit Discharge
  - Educational Outreach/Involvement
  - Good Housekeeping
  - Currently have 53 contracts with communities to perform various IDDE activities

- ### IDDE Program with Communities
- Communities can enter into an agreement with the Board of Health to perform a variety of activities:
    - Outfall inventory of designated MS4 outfalls
    - Dry weather inspections
    - Sampling of dry weather flows
    - Source tracking to locate illicit discharges
    - Public Education and Public Involvement
    - Good Housekeeping Program

## **IDDE Program with Communities**

- Establishing a hotline number for illegal dumping/spills and complaints for contracted communities for 2008
  
- Focus more on Source Tracking and on identifying hotspots utilizing:
  - Dry weather inspections
  - Sampling
  - Land use



## **IDDE Program with Communities**

- Communities enter into an MOU with the Board of Health.
- The MOU outlines what the Board of Health responsibilities are and what is expected of the Community
- MOU's will spell out costs
- MOU's will spell out time frame (Current MOU's range from 1 year to 5 years in length).
